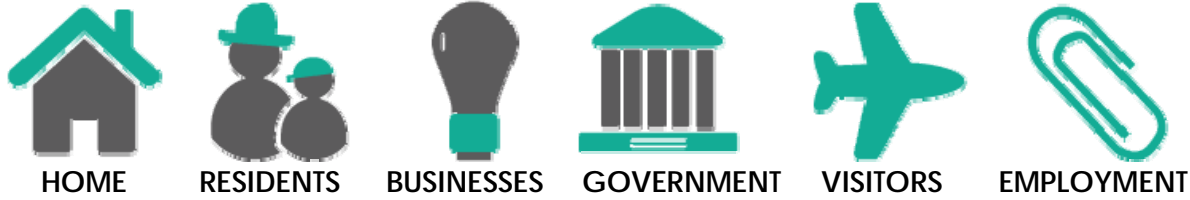

City Business

On Monday, September 12, the City Council set the millage rate for Fiscal Year 2017 to 4.15.

The millage rate sets the amount of money to be collected based on the total taxable value of each property established by the Orange County Appraiser's Office.

The City's portion of the tax bill for a Maitland resident, with a homesteaded property with a taxable value of \$300,000, is approximately 25 percent, or \$1,355. The remaining 75 percent goes to Orange County Public Schools, Orange County, and the St. Johns River Water Management District.

The City Council also demonstrated its continued commitment to Maitland's lakes and stormwater. The City Council set the environmental stormwater utility fee to \$10.39 (per equivalent residential unit per month), which is anticipated to generate \$1.4 million in stormwater fee revenue in FY 2017. Created in 2008, the Stormwater Environmental Utility Fund finances important lakes and stormwater projects such as retention ponds, nutrient-separating baffle boxes, stormwater collection systems, and drainage improvements.

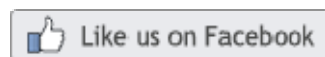
The Week Ahead
