In late 2016, the City installed bicycle-pedestrian trail signs throughout Maitland to encourage residents to walk or bike to their favorite Maitland destinations.

The signs direct bicyclists and pedestrians to local sites in the Downtown Maitland and West Maitland areas.

In this "Spotlight On" installment, Trail 5 takes center stage. Trail 5, via Horatio Avenue, connects residential trails 4, 4A, 4B, and 6 to Downtown Maitland.

Once they arrive in Downtown Maitland, bicyclists and pedestrians can access and take Trails 2, 3, and 17 to their final destination.

The 1.4 mile-trail along a very busy Maitland thoroughfare is for advanced riders and commuters. Observe and apply bicycle safety tips such as wearing a helmet and being aware of your surroundings.

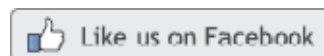
