It won't be long before the ground starts to rumble downtown. The illustration above depicts Maitland City Centre at the old Winn-Dixie site along U.S. 17-92 between Horatio and Packwood Avenues.

Two closely linked projects -- Maitland City Centre and the conversion of Independence Lane into a "Festival Street" design -- are in the final stages of preparation before the bulldozers move in. If things go according to plan, the demolition phase of the old Winn-Dixie building should begin in January. Stay tuned for a special event to commemorate this first step in Downtown Maitland's renovation.

Pipeline

The Public Works Department continues its work for all Maitland residents. Here you will find a list of completed projects and projects in the pipeline.

COMPLETED:



Kings Row Park. The following park amenities have been installed: benches, a fountain, trash receptacles, playground equipment, irrigation, and new sod.

IN THE PIPELINE AS OF 8/19/15:



Lift Station #4 Diversion Project. This project entails construction of over 9,500 feet of sewer force main throughout the eastern service area of the City. The pipeline will start on Old Horatio Avenue, and will proceed easterly to Dommerich Drive, Algonquin Trail, Arapaho Trail, and Mohican Trail, ending near Thistle Lane. Residents living along the construction path will receive a direct mail piece from the City. Visit www.bit.ly/StationNo4 often for updates.



Bridge Cover. Construction of a bridge cover over the Lake Nina Canal on Old Horatio Avenue started in late July and is anticipated to be completed in early September.



Pedestrian and Bicycle Access to the Maitland SunRail Station. A contractor has been selected and construction is slated to start in late August.
